



Dr. Floyd E. Williams, Jr.

Dr. Floyd Williams has a B.S. in Interdisciplinary Social Sciences from Marquette University, a M.S. in Administrative Leadership from Concordia University, and an Ed.D. in Leadership for the Advancement of Learning and Service from Cardinal Stritch University. He holds licenses for Superintendent: PreK-12, Principal: PreK-12, and Teacher: Grades 1-8. He is a member of the Administrators and Supervisors Council, Association for Supervision and Curriculum Development, International Reading Association, National Alliance of Black School Educators, National Association of Elementary School Principals, National Parent Teacher Association and many others.

During his tenure he has served as a science teacher, reading teacher and principal at the elementary, middle and high school levels as well as a central office administrator. In addition, Dr. Williams has also served as an adjunct instructor at the university level. His dedication has led to increased student achievement and has moved schools from need for improvement to satisfactory. His ability to turn schools around has made him a highly sought after leader that has been placed where his abilities were used to help students achieve success. His rigor and focus has not only helped schools academically, but also financially. Within one year as a principal of an elementary school, he activated a financial plan that resulted in the elimination of an \$88,000 deficit in the school's budget.

Due to his change management skills, Dr. Williams has become a mentor for beginning and experienced principals, helping them work through issues regarding improvement initiatives; fiscal management; staff supervision; implementation of systemic policies and procedures; and other critical school matters.

Dr. Williams has been able to make a significant difference in the lives of the children he serves; holding all of his students to high standards and accepting nothing less. In 2005, his innovative leadership style helped create Dr. George Washington Carver Academy of Mathematics and Science, a four-year-old Kindergarten through 8 school, of which he served as principal.

In 2004, Dr. Williams was recognized as the Sarah Scott Principal of the Year by the Metropolitan Milwaukee Alliance of Black School Educators. Dr. Williams was also featured in 2009 as one of three Milwaukee Principals whose individual style is making a difference in the lives of his students.

Before coming to District 62, Dr. Williams served as the Assistant Superintendent of Elementary School Leadership for the Kenosha Unified School District. Through his vision, he has had the ability to motivate educational organizations and communities to develop and support initiatives/programs that encourage students to achieve at their highest potential. He is a focused and disciplined leader with great vision, effective communication skills and a passion for students in the midst of triumph or adversity.

The Community Consolidated School District 62 Board of Education unanimously approved Dr. Floyd Williams on January 19, 2016 for the position of Superintendent of Schools. He officially began his new role in District 62 on July 1.
